The "Henry Ballantyne" is one of the clubs most coveted titles. Qualification to the match play phase is obtained through your best 2 net scores from 3 qualifying rounds. Top 16 players qualify. The mindset generally, is to "get a guid yin in early" and whilst everybody tried, most failed! Scoring on the first day of the new season was fairly high with the days average from 38 golfers being net 78, not including the 5 NR's. The lowest scratch score of the day was posted by Lyle

Caine, who did remarkably well to screw up an otherwise very tidy round of golf with a "bogey bogey" finish.

Taking third place was newly in post handicap secretary, Craig (Scrog) Archibald. A solid net 70 was good enough to secure "a podium finish" (bih) from Caravan Kid Boak who lived to rue his double bogey 7 on the 17<sup>th</sup>. Ed caught up with Craig recently and voiced his concern around the fact he appeared to have aged somewhat since taking on his new role. Scrog confirmed it was "a wee bit stressful" but commented that Gibby had put at least 3 years on him during the recent Daily Mail Foursome match v Peebles!

Our Texas Scramble — Open, was held on 8<sup>th</sup> April. With over 30 visitors to the course, this was a huge success for our club. We received excellent feedback (Eg. Very friendly and welcoming members and a wonderful course in brilliant condition. Although we didn't produce the wining team there were some notable performances from our members. Lowest scratch score of the day (62) came from MacFarlane, Caine (L) and Archibald. 6 birdies and one eagle gave them 3<sup>rd</sup> place. McArthur, Robertson (PP) and Foster who shot a scratch score "around about" their average age (68) ⑤. Superb golf from our seniors, however it wasn't quite enough for the win, which went to our visitors Codona, Docherty and Nailen from combined clubs in North Lanarkshire with an outstanding net 53!










View from south approach

There has been a marked increase in the volume of NR's in recent weeks. As such, the handicap committee have asked Ralf to publish a brief reminder to all members that you require to complete your round, even if you're having a bad day on course, unless you have a <u>valid</u> reason. Valid reasons for an NR, may include things like injury, illness, fading light at dusk, or a home or work emergency, <u>not</u> for eg. "I'm having a howler so I'm off to catch the second half"! If you fail to complete one particular hole you should still complete the remainder of your round.

### **Course Report**

During May the bunkers will be maintained. This will involve them being edged and topped up with sand. The trees on the course will be trimmed, especially on the 8th to improve visibility from the tee. The BT cable damage will be repaired, this will involve removing stones, lifting low areas and applying sand and seed. The fairways will continue to be patched and any protruding stones will be removed. Fairway distance markers will be tidied up. The fairways will be sprayed with a selective weedkiller to get rid of weeds, mainly daisies. Burns, paths and tree surrounds will also be sprayed. In June we will be into the full summertime maintenance program. Autumn 2023 — we hope to verti-drain and core all greens.
