We are facing some challenging times with our membership dropping on average 15% over the last few years.

I also acknowledge that the course struggled early in the season last year and we hopefully have things in place to avoid any such problems this year. We are also hoping to organize some social events this year so once again any support would be appreciated.

#### House

The past year has seen several new innovations including a new and more extensive vending machine, improved club house lighting, a defibrillator and a plinth/stroke honesty box housing the computer and completed competition cards.

The direct access to the computer allows members to record their scores electronically on the Handicap-master system and view up to date results. It also cuts down the administration of competitions.

The BRS booking system goes from strength to strength and has allowed us to extend online forward tee time reservations. Tee off times for Open events are now available from the start of the season. We would like to encourage members to book "bounce games" on line as this very much helps us monitor the usage of the course.

The web cam facility has been welcomed by both members and visitors and allows five different views of the course. It can be found via the club website under the heading club and course. We have plans to extend this facility.

A very successful mountain bike event took place in July and we are exploring closer links with the biking community for usage of the club and parking areas.

Other developments for this year include a "Fly Over" video of the course which will be available via the web site and a new club brochure to be placed in tourist offices, hotels and local business'.

The biggest improvement comes with the re-introduction of a catering service for members and visiting parties. This will commence as of the 4th March and will focus on Saturdays and larger events. See sample menu on this page.

Several functions are planned including annual presentation and Captain v Vice Captain match, (25th March), open to all members and the Monday Morning Group AGM (27th March). All members who have reached the 65+ years are welcome to join this vibrant social group who play on Monday mornings.

We are investigating new funding opportunities and closer links with other clubs and would welcome any suggestions.

#### Catering

We are delighted to welcome Dawn and Linda, who will be providing catering for the new season on a trial basis.

#### **Greens Report**

After a challenging period last year, our main priorities for 2017 are the putting greens.

As well as seeking to maintain and improve their quality, we are looking to enlarge some of them.

Drainage work on and around the 6<sup>th</sup> green continues, where we will shortly be burying pipes deeper and laying gravel.

Areas of tiger rough have been returned to rough in areas around the course, particularly on the  $3^{\rm rd}$  and  $6^{\rm th}$ .

We are looking to improve and enhance paths for buggy access, and this work has begun.

Finally, we will be looking to address the much promised work on the 9<sup>th</sup> Tee, with budget made available for this.

#### Treasurer

Unfortunately we have seen a reduction in members again this past year, (we have just 146 members in all categories) which led to a loss of approx £5000 of income. However, a combination of the £1000 sink fund, £1460 of donations from members, and an increase in green fees has meant the cost of running the club was covered.

Despite a bad start, the improved condition of the course in July onwards lead to an increase in visitors and thus income.

Expenditure was kept under good control- the vending machine had to be replaced, a new plinth for the club computer and sand boxes were purchased . The course upkeep was £3681 & the fairway cutter repair cost £1500 . The spending on the course was on budget, but the fairway cutter machine repair was more than budgeted for.

Club costs are expected to be around £60,0000 for the coming year - members fees will need to be increased to run the club, any donations are a bonus. A planned budget at the same level as last year, with no cuts to the spend on the course, is the aim.

captain Peter Irvine, who deciding to play safe on the 15<sup>th</sup>, took his trusted
3 Wood out of the bag. Peter managed to hit his 3 Wood a full 310 yards!!,
although unfortunately for him this was the vertical distance achieved, the
ball finally coming to rest 25 yards from the tee.

Donnie Campbell is looking for volunteers to help him out with juniors on Sunday afternoons – can you give up just an hour of your time?


You do not have to be members, or even play golf, extra eyes and assistance all required, so please speak to friends and family as well.

#### Change of Golf Rules - Consultation

As some of you will be aware, the R&A and USPGA are currently consulting on significant changes to the rules of golf.

Some of the changes being considered are:

- Remove any penalty for accidentally moving your ball.
- Relax the protocols for taking free or penalty drops, with the ball dropped from only an inch above the ground, rather than shoulder height.
- Use fixed distances (20 or 80 inches) rather than club lengths to measure areas where a ball should be dropped.
- Reduce the time allowed to search for a lost ball from five to three minutes (we understand Craig Phaup is particularly upset on this one).
- Allow putting on the green with the flagstick left in the hole.
- Allow players to repair spike marks and animal damage on greens.
- Automatically allow the use of distance measuring devices.
- Recommend no player takes more than 40 seconds to hit a shot.
- Encourage players in strokeplay to implement "ready golf" rather than waiting until it is their turn to hit.
- Empower committees to set a maximum score for a hole (such as double par or triple bogey) to allow a player to pick up and move to the next hole.
